Dear Parents and Guardians:

Welcome to St. John the Evangelist School (SJE)! We look forward to working with our faculty, staff, and families in the upcoming school year. The SJE Home and School Association (HSA) seeks to create a community where all parents and guardians feel welcomed, engaged, and included in the school's mission to integrate Catholic philosophy with academic excellence. We are here to help implement the objectives of the HSA:

### Building Community

SJE is known for its strong sense of community and emphasis on serving others. We are ever thankful for the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and their example of joyful, loving service. Beginning in preschool, the faculty and staff consciously teach our students the importance of imitating Christ by serving others as He did. By participating in a variety of social and fundraising events throughout the year, we parents and guardians can dovetail with that instruction and help the message really hit home with our students.

What time, talent, or treasure can you share with our community? Please review the attached information on volunteer opportunities and see what interests you. There are many ways to help, and no experience is necessary—just a positive attitude and sense of fun! Each family is asked to sign up for no less than three volunteer roles over the course of the year.

### Raising Funds to Help Keep Tuition Affordable

We have worked hard to maintain the family fundraising obligation at the same level for another year, which remains set at \$370. This fundraising helps to keep our tuition cost affordable. With so many ways to meet that obligation, last year we had many families exceed their obligation, which is a great help as we pursue our annual fundraising goal of \$55,000. We are also continuing the program to reduce the financial obligation for chairpersons of fundraising events that reach certain benchmarks. That means that if an event raises over \$2500, the chair receives a \$150 credit toward the family's outstanding obligation, and if an event raises over \$5000, the chair receives a \$300 credit toward any outstanding obligation. (If there are co-chairs the credit could be split evenly). This past year, three fundraisers met one of these benchmarks.

### Fostering Communication

Throughout the year, we provide an avenue of communication among parents, guardians, school staff, and the School Advisory Board (SAB). Our SJE e-bulletins contain the most current, up-to-date information and are sent out each week throughout the school year.
